## News From the Chair

### **Collaboration with Elections New Brunswick**

Daniel Stockemer and Nick Bordeleau conducted a survey experiment in collaboration with Elections New Brunswick on a novel video-based information campaign developed by Elections New Brunswick. By comparing responses of those who watched the video and those who did not, the researchers could deduce clear findings. The research finds that the study participants who watched the video display increased knowledge of the electoral process, more satisfaction with the electoral management body, and higher perceptions of electoral integrity. These results will guide the voter information campaign that Elections New Brunswick will launch in September and October 2024, before their provincial election.
